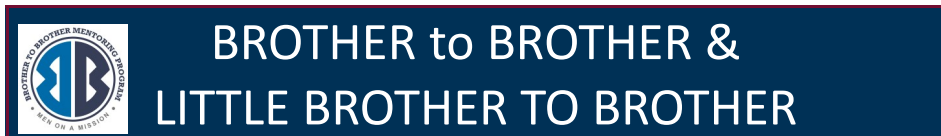

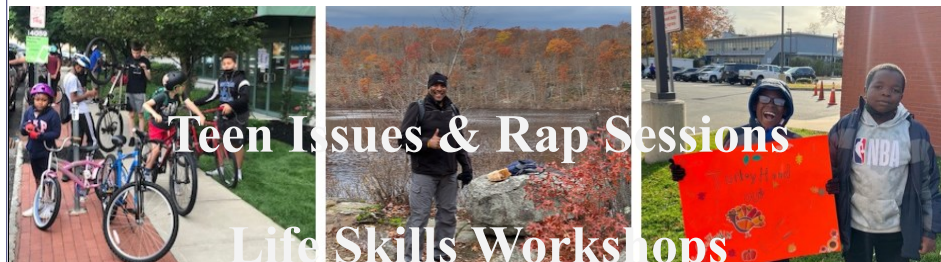

## MISSION STATEMENT

Our group mentoring activities are school-anchored and community-based programs that are designed to actively foster safe, nurturing, and positive relationships between adult mentors and teen male protégés. We seek to inspire program participants with the highest ideals of character, conduct, and educational achievement, so that they may become productive and empowered young men of their communities.

## HISTORY

Brother to Brother, a 501(c)3 non-profit program, was established in 2007 to meet the needs of vulnerable males by providing an atmosphere where they can work on fundamental skills required to achieve academic and social excellence. The program is open to all male students ranging from the 4th through 12th grades.



## OUR OBJECTIVES

With community, municipal, and school support we promote academic achievement and help prepare students for college or trade school.

To promote healthy lifestyles by advocating drug-free, alcohol-free, tobacco-free, and crime-free behavior.

To help students develop anger management awareness and techniques and to improve their decision and problem-solving skills.

To teach financial literacy and the value of community service; foster self-confidence and self-advocacy, and provide communication workshops for participant parents/caregivers.

## WHO QUALIFIES?

Male students who are currently enrolled in the Montclair school system in grades 4 to 12, qualify to participate in the Brother to Brother program.

## WHO ARE THE MENTORS?

The program mentors are a dedicated group of professionals from a diverse set of occupations. Mentors offer guidance, a listening ear, and an experienced perspective on life. A mentor serves as a role model and sounding board for the young men as they move into independent living and adulthood.

They help students set attainable goals and map out plans to achieve them. Brother to Brother is always looking to accept applications from interested mentor volunteers from the community. Each application is reviewed through an intensive screening process and the applicant must fill out an online application at [teenmentoring.org](http://teenmentoring.org) and consent to a background check.

## HOW OFTEN DO WE MEET?

Mentoring sessions, for both groups, are held weekly on **Tuesdays**, from **5:30 PM until 7:30 PM.**, and generally follow the student's school schedule from October through May.

We will sometimes meet outside this schedule based on the number of field trips, community service projects, or fundraisers pre-scheduled for the academic year. Please see our calendar on the back cover for more program details.

## PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Students must be enrolled in school and be in the 4th to 12th grades. Parents/caregivers are **required** to complete the online application at [teenmentoring.org](http://teenmentoring.org). Parents/caregivers and students should commit to participating in the mentoring program for the entire academic year, and adhere to all program rules and requirements.
